On the beach of Vlychada in Santorini, with the impressive volcanic rock formations, the Tomato Industrial Museum "D. Nomikos" with its characteristic chimney that dominates the lunar landscape, narrates stories, not only about the business history of Nomikos' family, but also about time, memories and the inhabitants of the island. The old tomato factory D. Nomikos in Vlychada was transformed in 2014 into a modern Industrial Museum to offer its visitors a flashback to the past, following the procedure of cultivation, processing and production of small-fruited tomatoes, a Protected Designation of Origin (PDO) product since 2006, and one of the most famous and traditional products of Santorini.



Official Language

English is the official language of the course. There will be no simultaneous translation.

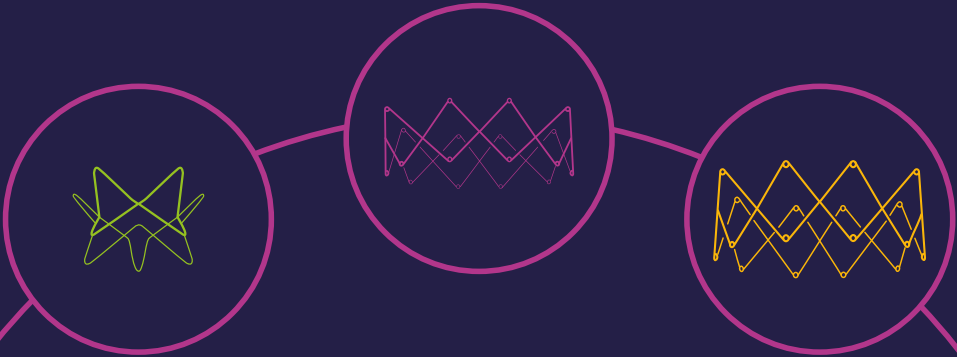
